Just five years later, Connor has become a competitive cyclist - with a cause. Last June, he was the youngest rider to finish the Race Across America, a 3,000-mile team bike race that spans the United States. Connor competed to raise money for research and awareness of organ donation, carning \$107,000 for Team Donate Life.

Last year, Courtney swam, biked, and ran her way to the 2010 ronKids National Triathlon Championship for six-year-old girls. She won two ronKids triathlons in Colorado to qualify for the nationals in St. Petersburg, Florida, where she was first in her age group by more than a minute.

Makayla is a scoring machine on the soccer field. She netted 19 goals in seven games to help her team, the Anthem Lightning, finish 7-0 in the Arizona Division II state league. Makayla also runs cross-country. Her time of 16:07 in the two-mile race was one of the top finishes for her school this season.



COLF Kirran Magowan, 13 Loveland, Ohio

Kirran won three tournaments to earn the title of 2010 Southern Ohio PGA Junior Tour Player of the Year for boys in the 12-13 age group. He also won the Junior World Ohio Qualifier, Cincinnati City Open, and the Cincinnati Middle School League Championship, all with scores under par.
